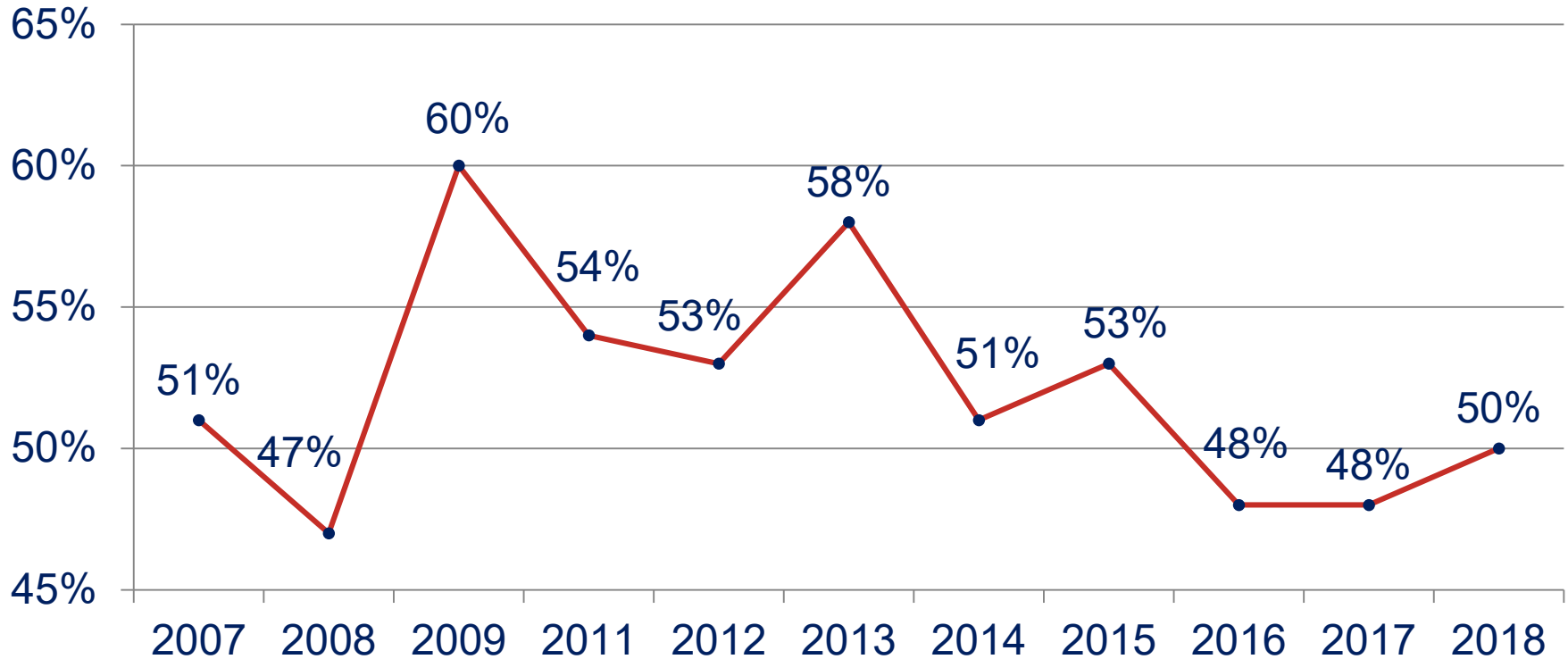

Procedural justice is defined as the idea of fairness in the processes that resolve disputes and allocate resources.

It is a philosophy and practice which promotes positive organizational change, builds police legitimacy in the community, and enhances officer safety.

100% of officers have received procedural justice training and will continue to receive such training.

The Department will also continue to implement procedural justice concepts.

Procedural Justice Initiatives



Procedural justice progress includes:

- ❖ Implementation of body-worn cameras
- ❖ Implementation of de-escalation procedure and training
- ❖ Trained on implicit bias
- ❖ Increased community outreach
- ❖ Coordinating with municipal, county and state government to address justice reform
- ❖ Increased Crisis Intervention Team officers
- ❖ Partnership with Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services

Trauma-Informed Policing



The Department is implementing trauma-informed policing training.

Trauma-informed policing is a style of policing where officers are educated on trauma and the impact it has on people so officers can:

- ❖ Minimize the infliction of or exposure to any unnecessary trauma;
- ❖ Provide support and services;
- ❖ Obtain greater cooperation from victims and witnesses; and
- ❖ Provide a better experience with the criminal justice system.

Handle with Care

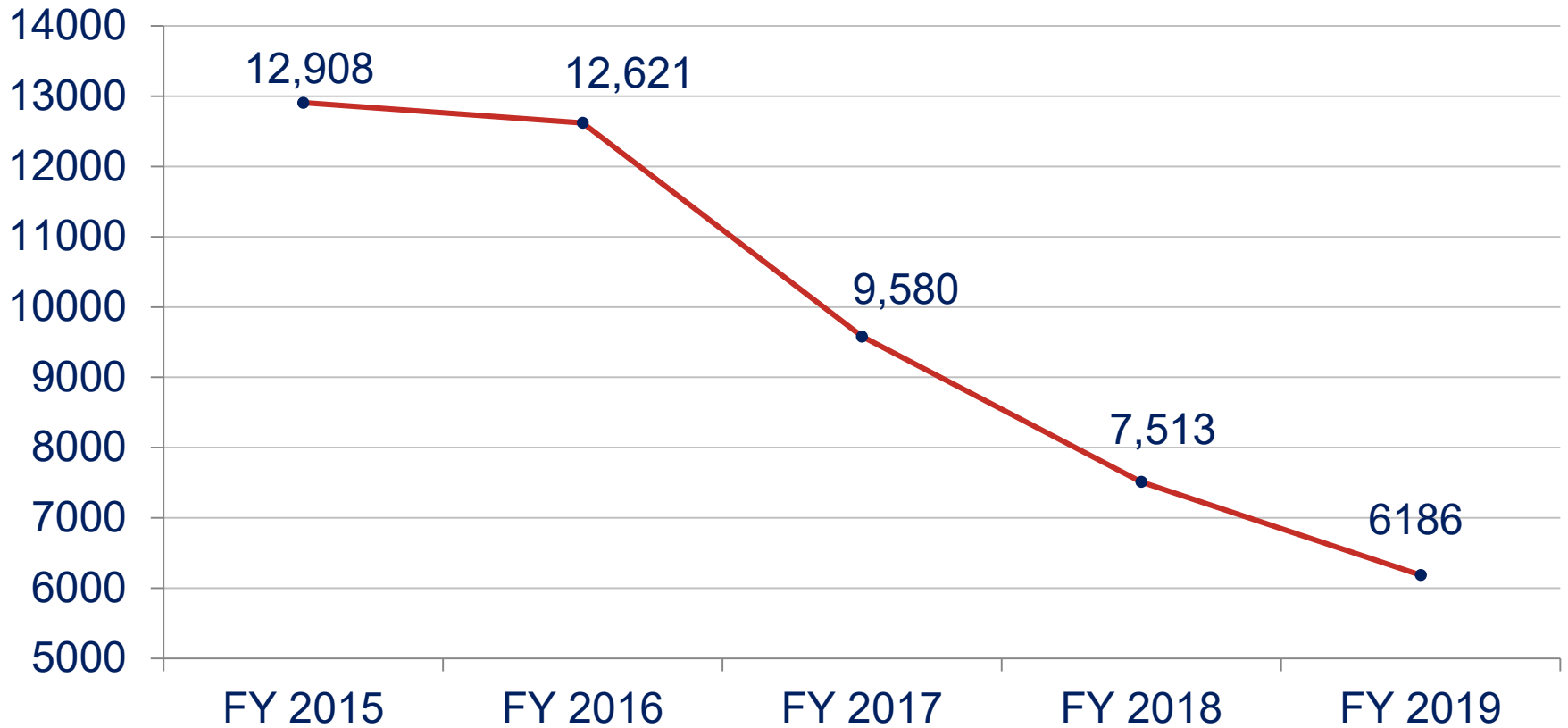


The Department has partnered with Oklahoma City school officials through an initiative called Handle with Care.

When officers encounter a child that has been exposed to trauma of any kind, officers notify the child's school.

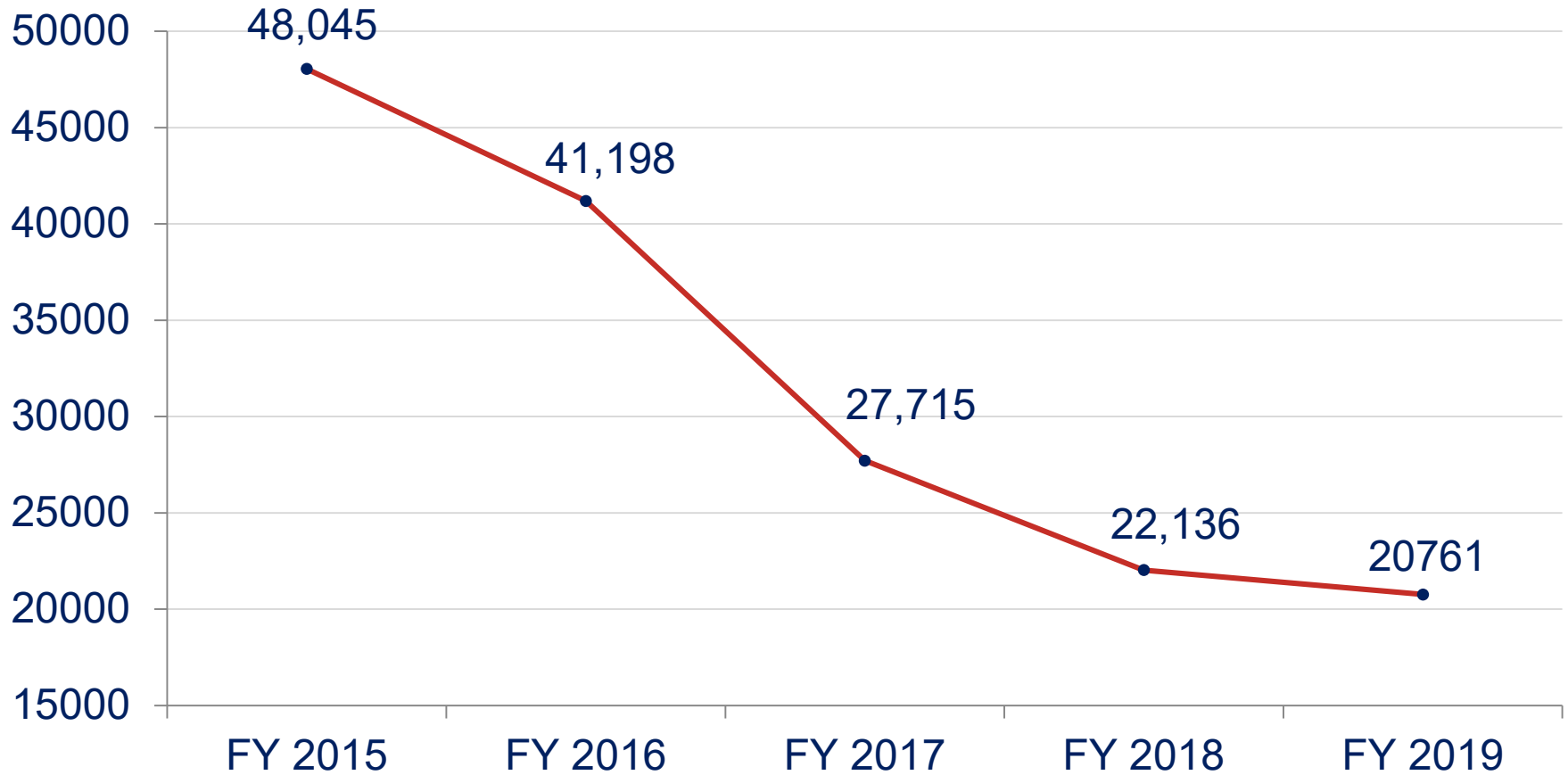
This notification triggers the attention of school counselors who monitor the child and provide extra care.
